SERVICE OF REMEMBRANCE - Our service of remembrance will take place on Sunday 11th November at 10.30am. To mark the end of World One, some 1,400 bell ringers have been recruited to mark 100 years. They will represent the 1,400 bell ringers who died in the conflict. Bells in churches and cathedrals will ring out on 11 November and Big Ben will also strike to mark the centenary of Armistice Day. Our own ringers will take part in this special occasion. More details to follow. We will also be welcoming back members of our Orchestra-in-Residence, the Sheffield Festival Orchestra, who will be accompanying the Consort & Songmen in the second of our liturgical orchestral mass series that morning.
