TEN WAYS TO KEEP GOING TO CHURCH DURING LOCKDOWN

- Encourage others to join online worship at St John's via Zoom or Facebook

LENT STUDY COURSE - The season of Lent offers an opportunity intentionally to set a little time aside for reflection and study. This year's Lent Course will be based on the Bloomsbury Lent Book for 2021 'Thy Will Be Done' by Stephen Cherry, Dean of King's College, Cambridge. The book takes an in-depth look at the Lord's Prayer and uses six key words from the prayer as themes for reflection: Heaven, Earth, Bread, Temptation, Forgiveness, Glory.

Everyone is very welcome. No previous experience of study courses is necessary! The sessions will include space for reflection, prayer and conversation based on the short chapters in each of the six topic areas mentioned above. We are delighted to be linking again with our friends at Nether Green Methodist Church who will be joining us for the course. Do let friends from other churches know about the course if their church is unable to run one this year. Each week there will be two session times available:

- Tuesdays 2.30pm-3.30pm (23rd February to 30th Mar incl.)
- Wednesdays 7.00pm-8.00pm (24th February to 31st March incl.)

closing the digital divide

LAPTOPS FOR KIDS-Laptops for Kids is a charitable organisation that facilitates the donation, secure erasure and distribution of used digital devices, enabling children from disadvantaged backgrounds to have access to the technology they need to participate in remote learning. We

are collecting any laptops, tablets, PCs and so on. These are being securely erased and given to the city's disadvantaged young people, free of charge, enabling them to do the schoolwork they couldn't do without a computer. With so many children home-schooling now, you can imagine for some families it's a real struggle especially as most work is given online and many families have little access to IT equipment for It would be really good before people donate equipment to check on the specs to make sure they are suitable for schools. The process is to ask people to fill in their details on the form, and then if they are suitable we ask them to drop off - would it be possible to pass this on to anyone considering making a donation to avoid receiving devices that might not be suitable? REACH SLEEP-IN/OUT FOR ROUNDABOUT - Several of our young people gave up their beds as the nights were drawing in and temperatures were dropping towards the end of last year. With most of the sponsor money collected REACH has raised just short of £500 for young homeless people in Sheffield. This is a great effort – thank you so much to all those who took part. There's a little unfinished business in that I had planned to do the Sleep-In myself but a poorly vicar in November and moving house in early December meant that I have only just got round to getting this organised. 


IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ZOOM USERS
