<u>NEW DIRECTOR OF MUSIC</u> - A very warm welcome to Philip Collin who has started this week as Director of Music here at St John's. Philip and his family will be involved in church life, and we look forward to welcoming them to our church family. On behalf of everyone here at St John's we warmly welcome you.

CHURCH BUILDING – NEW RISK ASSESSMENT FOR CHURCH – now that we are in stage 4 of the recovery plan, we have revised our guidelines for the church. The main difference is that we have removed social distancing in the middle of the church (side aisles are still socially distanced), and masks are not compulsory. Our guidance is that you wear a mask whilst moving around in church and singing. Sanitiser will be available, and Communion will take place without wine. We hope to review these guidelines again in September before the choirs return fully.
