CHURCH BUILDING – NEW RISK ASSESSMENT FOR CHURCH – now that we are in stage 4 of the recovery plan, we have revised our guidelines for the church. The main difference is that we have removed social distancing in the middle of the church (side aisles are still socially distanced), and masks are not compulsory. Our guidance is that you wear a mask whilst moving around in church and singing. Sanitiser will be available, and Communion will take place without wine. We understand that some people are still shielding and may not feel ready to return to the church building and we will continue to broadcast on ZOOM (until Harvest Sunday) and Facebook live each week for the morning service. MIDWEEK EVENSONG we are pleased to announce that Midweek evensong is back on a Wednesday during term time at 5.30pm.

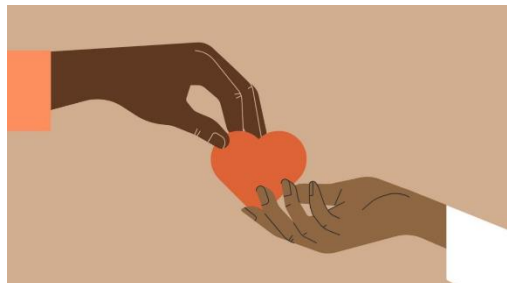
