Welcome and introduction

Welcome to Sanctuary

During this time set apart for stillness, there are opportunities in word and music to reflect on our personal spiritual life; the relationship we enter into with Jesus Christ through prayer and how we might most fruitfully pray for others.

May this be for you a time of rest, reflection and intentional abiding in word, prayer and silence.

Some thoughts as we enter into this time together:

Prayer does not change God, but it changes him (sic) who prays.

Throughout this short reflective liturgy feel free to say the words out loud or pray them in the silence of your heart. God is listening.

Greeting

From scattered lives we come together now to meet with God. Let us recognize his presence with us.

Silence is kept

As God's people we have gathered: Let us worship him together.

Come O Lord and visit us in peace, that we may rejoice before you with a perfect heart.

The text comes from Psalm 55, the text of which is included below.

The Word of God

Matthew 6.1-15

Jesus said to the disciples, 'Beware of practising your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven.

'So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

'And whenever you pray, do not be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

'When you are praying, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think that they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.

3. What might be standing in our way on the days when 'we cannot pray' (Duffy)?
