The young people in our congregation have designed the card. Any donations left in the box by the card can be cash or cheques payable to **Phoenix Association** (PA). PA is an independent registered charity which devotes its entire effort to supporting the residents and staff of the separate charity Phoenix Futures (PF)which provides

residential rehabilitation treatment in Sheffield for people in recovery from substance misuse. Up to 90 people can be in residence in the Sheffield PF houses at one time. PA raises funds and donates them for residents' sport, education, outdoor activities and resettlement and we also form a friendly "bridge" between the people at PF in Sheffield and the local community. What help PA can provide is extra to that which PF provides and we know that our input does help to increase the rates of retention

within the treatment programme. PA is unique in that it is the only local community support organisation to PF at any of PF's locations. Phoenix Association would be most grateful for any donation made by St John's congregation.
