LATEST BLOG – Pew Renting: Did you know that up until the 20th century, churches like St John's, Ranmoor used pew renting to fund clergy and upkeep? The rich sat front and centre, while their servants were tucked away in the back-ironically under the eyes of a preacher quoting, "the

last shall be first and the first last." This quirky system left behind a treasure: a detailed pew map from 1890 that gives us a glimpse into the diverse lives of past churchgoers from wealthy steel magnates like Robert Colver and Samuel Earnshaw Howell, to humble, often forgotten workers.
